He has served on the Visit Orlando Board for five years and chaired its Global Marketing Committee for two years.

"We are pleased that Ed will champion Florida Hospital's fundraising efforts to battle cancer in Central Florida and beyond."

Throughout his career he has won over 100 ADDY Awards for Creative Excellence and two EMMY's for Television Excellence. In 2006, he was inducted into the Florida Tourism Hall of Fame. With his many achievements and illustrious career, Gilbert also dedicates time to take on new volunteer and charity opportunities.

"Three family members and two close friends died of cancer, and I felt it was time to give more back to my community in addition to my Visit Orlando volunteering," said Gilbert. "It gives me a great sense of pride to spend my time helping others."

Gilbert has been married to his wife, Connie, for 28 years and has a daughter who is an actress in New York City.
